GOOD MORNING

I read a story based on the parable of talents that I though was very fitting for our time. There was a king who had three sons, each with a special talent. One had a talent for growing fruit, another for raising sheep and third could play the violin. The king had to go overseas on business. So, he instructed his three sons that they were in charge of keeping the people contented in his absence. Things went well until a harsh winter hit. There was a firewood shortage, and the first son was face with a difficult decision, allow the people to cut down some of his beloved fruit trees for firewood or not? When he saw the people shivering in the cold, he decided he had to. As the harsh winter food became short, the second was face with whether or not to let them kill some of his beloved sheep for food. But when he saw the children crying in hunger, he gave up some of his sheep so they could eat. The second son was also faced with a difficult decision. So, the people had firewood for their fires, and food for their tables, but still the long winter had affected the people's spirits and they were sad. They turned to the fiddler, but he refused to play for them. Things got so grim that some of the people decide to leave the kingdom and look for a better life elsewhere.

When the king returned, he was sad to see what was happening to his kingdom. He called in his three sons to give an account of what had gone wrong. The first said, "Father, I hope you won't be mad at me, but the winter was very cold and so I allowed the people to cut down some of the fruit trees for firewood." And the second son said, "Father, I hope you won't be mad at me because when food got scarce, I allowed the people to kill some of my sheep." On hearing this, far from being angry, the father embraced his two sons, and told them that he was proud of them. Then the third son came forward carrying his fiddle with him. "Father", he said, "I refused to play because you weren't here to enjoy the music." "Well then", said the king, "play me a tune now because my heart is full of sorrow." The son raised the violin and bow but found that his fingers had gone stiff from lack of exercise. No matter how hard he tried, he could not get them to move. Then the father said, "You could have cheered up the people with your music, but you refused and now you can no longer play. That will be your punishment."

The parable of the talents in the Bible reminds us that we are servants of God, and we have a responsibility to use the gifts and abilities God has given us. This adaptation points out that in hard times we might not be able to use our gifts like we had in the past, but that does not mean we cannot continue to find ways to serve the Lord. So, even in these strange times, let us continue to find ways that we might be able to serve our King, so that one day we all will be able to hear those words, "Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter the joy of your master.'
