### WHY LORD?

While reading this week, I ran across a passage in the little book of Habakkuk that shakes me to the core each time I read it. In the context of the book, God is raising up the Babylonian empire to punish his own people and because of their idolatry and their rebellion against God, they deserve what they get. Habakkuk cries out to God with questions that could have come from the mouths of any of us: "Why the injustice?" "Why do you tolerate wrongdoing?" "Why destruction, violence, strife and conflict?" Habakkuk goes on to say that the law is paralyzed and justice is perverted and these are just the first of his many questions. Why, God, is all this happening to us? Where are you?

God's answers are blunt, but just. He is looking for those who will live by faith in Him (2:4). Habakkuk, a man of faith, still has questions. He still asks "why?" Despite God's words of justice and eventual deliverance, Habakkuk expresses his fear and apprehension at the condition of his land and the coming violence.

What strikes me are the words at the very end of the little book. The threats he spoke of are still present. The times are hard, and even desperate. Yet Habakkuk expresses faith in the God who will lift him up. Through faith he can see through the clouds of the world around him and see the sunshine of God's deliverance. He says in chapter 3, verses 17-19, "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. The Sovereign Lord is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to tread on the heights."

Looking around at our lives and our world, it is easy to find ourselves asking the same question: "Why Lord? Why am I having to go through this right now? In spite of what happens around us, can we trust the Lord and rejoice in Him?
