## COLLISIONS OF LOVE

**Matthew 5:21-22 -- You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' 22But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to his brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin. But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell.**

So many times, we miss the point. As someone commented, "the simple moral fact is that words kill." This passage may be talking to us about any number of things, but one thing is for sure: it warns us of the destructive potential of words. The tragedy in the way too many of us face conflict is that we are so competitive we want to win every argument, regardless of the relationship or the damage done in the process. Many times, we win the battle, but lose the war. We fail to realize the long-lasting damage that can be done when ego attacks become part of the argumentative process.

When was the last time we considered the damage of hurtful words? We MUST remind ourselves daily that angry outbursts of lethal words damage self-concepts and destroy personal relationships. The power of words to do harm is far more than we might realize. In the heat of our conflicts, we MUST avoid saying things that can do unbelievable damage to the self-esteem of the person we are talking to, as well as the relationship itself. We must realize that part of God's holy Spirit within us is the characteristic of self-control which will help us win the victory in this arena of our lives. Because of God's provision, we are NOT powerless to control our angry outbursts. Through his Holy Spirit, HE WILL give us the power of self-control. It is up to us to employ it.

What kind of role must one be willing to accept in righting damaged relationships? we need to dedicate ourselves to being encouragers. We never know how God will use just a few words to change the course of lives.

Listen again to what Jesus offers concerning relationships:

**Matt. 5:23-25- 23"Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, 24leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift. 25"Settle matters quickly with your adversary who is taking you to court. Do it while you are still with him on the way, or he may hand you over to the judge, and the judge may hand you over to the officer, and you may be thrown into prison.**

Jesus says that well-functioning relationships are some of the greatest gifts we can offer to God. Sometimes we just forget. May Jehovah God help us to remember and to be about the business of repairing and building relationships. God bless us all.
